(Continued from Page 1-C) upon therein. The agreement would, of course, have to provide for its own execution and enforcement.

The third method suggested contemplates legal determination, through court action and orders, of all features involved. Such determination in the first instance would be predicated upon all facts and evidence reflecting conditions as of a given time, and would be subject to periodic revisions to reflect changing conditions. This method, while the most complex and expensive of the three methods suggested, would nevertheless constitute the ultimate, enforceable solution of the problem.

Fortunately, there is a precedent in the matter of procedure if this third method is pursued. The water service areas and Basins involved in the City of Pasadena vs. City of Alhambra case, where the results achieved therein up to this time are indicative of the character and type of action, investigation, reference and control which such method affords.

However, it must be here noted that the relation of the West Basin to available sources of imported water is somewhat different to the area involved in the Pasadena vs. City of Alhambra case. In order that an adequate supply of water for the consumers in the West Basin be available over the period required for court action, reference and final judgment, it will be desirable that the major producers and users agree on a source or sources of imported water. It will also be desirable for these major producers to agree on the type of action necessary to enable these sources of water to be made available in the West Basin Area.

In the Pasadena vs. Alhambra case, an adjustment of adequate imported water supplies already available to the area was required while in the West Basin area, the issue will be a readjustment of inadequate supplies within the basin and the importation, use and payment of imported waters to make up the shortage. Generally, however, the plan used in the Pasadena vs. Alhambra case applies.

Under this plan one or more producers from the Basin could join as parties plaintiff in a Superior Court action, joining all the other producers and owners entitled to produce from the West Basin, as parties defendant.

This type of action is in the nature of an action to quiet title. The court is called upon to determine the respective rights of the various parties, both plaintiff and defendant, to take, divert, and use the waters within the area involved, and to enjoin each party found to own a right to take or divert water from the Basin from taking thereof in any year, water in such volume as, when added to the amount which the other parties shall be adjudged and decreed to be entitled to take and divert, would result in a total annual diversion from the Basin in excess of the average, annual supply of water thereto or safe yield of the Basin, as determined by the Court.

ences to the number of producers and owners entitled to produce from the Basin, it is apparent that the litigation would involve a very considerable expense on the part of the producer or producers who were designated as plaintiffs.

This type of action contemplates that at proper stage the Court will refer the technical features of an engineering and physical factural nature involved to a Referee. In the Pasadena vs. Alhambra Case the Division of Water Resources of the State of California was appointed and acted as Referee.

The Referee then proceeds to such investigations, surveys, hearings, roundtable discussions and research, as will enable it to report to the Court respecting the technical and physical factural features referred.

When the Referee has completed its investigation and survey, etc., it files a report of its findings and determinations with the Court. Opportunity is then afforded all parties to inspect and file objections and exceptions to the report of the Referee with the Court. The Court then proceeds to hear and resolve all objections and exceptions so made.

The Court then being fully advised makes its Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and thereafter makes its Judgment, based upon such findings and conclusions. Such judgment determines the extent of the Basin which may be shown on a map attached to the Judgment.

The Judgment also determines the safe yield of the Basin; the annual production therefrom; the amount of water pumped or taken by parties of the action, and the amount of water taken or pumped by non-parties to the action, if any, it being contemplated by the Committee that all known producers be joined as parties.

The judgment also determines the relative rights of the respective parties to take water from the Basin, which for the purposes of convenience are sometimes referred to as "Prescribed Rights", and also determines the limited or reduced amounts which each of the respective parties is entitled to withdraw from the Basin in order to maintain and protect the supply of water in the ground in the Basin. These limited rights for the purposes of convenience are usually designated as "Decreed Rights".

The Judgment then enjoins and restrains each of the respective parties from taking or diverting from the Basin or (except in given instances such as in cases of emergency or the like) from any source contributing to the supply of water in the Basin, any water beyond the "Decreed Right" of such party.

There seems to be a good crop of pheasants this year which are attracting a great many game law violators. In August, 30 arrests and convictions were made by wardens of the State Division of Fish and Game for taking pheasants during the closed season, and these violators paid \$2405 in fines.

Similar offenses seem to be continuing in September with the arrest of John G. Ahlfeld of Pasadena and C. E. Mortimer of Chino by fish and game wardens for killing three hen pheasants. Taken before Judge George E. McCauley (Torona), bail was set at \$100 each, which was forfeited.

Also arrested on the first of the month was Robert C. Jones of Modesto for taking and having wild pheasant and quail in possession during the closed season. Fish and Game Warden George Magladry cited Jones to appear before Judge Leslie K. Floyd of Modesto, who fined Jones \$150.

Thousands of Fish Saved by Salvage Work

Fish rescue work carried on by the California State Division of Fish and Game in the Santa Ynez River in Santa Barbara County resulted in the salvaging of 1,010,300 fingerling steelhead, or 4119 pounds of fish. This work was started in June and was completed early in August by the division's Bureau of Fish Conservation with the aid of the local wardens. The fish rescued were distributed in the following streams: In Santa Barbara County 746,880 were planted in Indian Creek, Happy Canyon Creek, Gibraltar Reservoir, Cold Springs Creek, Zaca Creek, Davy Brown Creek, San Jose Creek, Elmer Creek and Solvang Dyke Pond.

In addition 485,540 fish were planted in the lagoon at the mouth of the river near Surf. In Ventura County 146,720 fish were planted in Rincon Creek, Santa Clara River and Ventura River, and in San Luis Obispo County 116,640 fish were planted in Salinas Reservoir, Santa Rosa Lagoon and Arroyo Grande Creek.

These fish that were saved would have otherwise been lost because of the drying up of certain sections of the river.
