Fair Fleet Group Forms Corporation

Fair Fleet, which has been highly publicized throughout the world since it was conceived and founded by Edsel Newton, well known Torrance marine feature writer, has formed a non-profit corporation, with a view to proceeding with its plans and programs immediately.

The stated purposes of the corporation as listed in the article of incorporation under the laws of the State of California are:

To obtain the cooperation and participation of all interested persons, firms, groups and organizations in the promotion and operation of a fleet of ships: (a) to carry to leading world ports a World Fair, offering an opportunity to all persons to attend which otherwise would be restricted to a comparative few who had the time and means to travel to and from points of great distance where World Fairs would otherwise be held; (b) to encourage and stimulate world trade and lasting peace through the goodwill tours and efforts exerted by this corporation; (c) to promote and foster, through the medium of a World Fair, principles of Democracy and Americanism, and to create a better understanding and good will among the people of all nations; (d) to coordinate these goodwill plans, programs and purposes through recognized governmental and trade agencies throughout the world.

Fair Fleet has already been named internationally as the most ingenious plan for the perpetuation of world trade and lasting peace, and several ports are attempting to have the organization headquartered near them, and have the fair inaugurated and set sail on their initial tour.

Incorporators are: Edsel Newton, Colonel Roger Q. Williams, famous Trans-Atlantic flier, and H. B. Lewis.

War Regulations On Lacquers And Paints Lifted

War regulations that formerly prevailed in connection with the sale of paints, varnishes, lacquers and other protective coatings, have now been lifted according to Hector C. Haight, manager of the Los Angeles Agency of the Reconstruction Finance Corporation.

"Effective today West Coast purchases may select from our surplus inventories such war-scarce commodities as canvas, ready-mixed rubber, deck, marine, water, lead and miscellaneous paints, paint primers, stains, thinners, enamels, and fillers," Haight said.

The Reconstruction Finance Corporation which has been designated by the Surplus Property Division to dispose of aircraft plants, capital and producers' goods, is located at 523 W. Sixth Street.
