Blind Dog Work Explained To Torrance Lions

The greatest benefit a blind person receives from the use of a guide dog is in the knowledge that he no longer is required to depend upon some member of his family or a friend for constant attention and guidance.

So stated C. F. Lancaster, chairman of the Lion Aid Committee for Redondo Beach Lions club, at the meeting Tuesday of Torrance Lions club.

Blind since the battle of Belleau Wood, France, where he served with the U. S. Marines in World War I, Lancaster told of the many benefits a sightless person receives from the use of a guide dog. He said that they now are used legally on trains, buses and street cars; in elevators, going in and out of buildings; in restaurants, theaters, traffic and any place where a normal person goes.

He declared that there are 4,000 blind persons in Los Angeles county, and that the most one trainer can do is to turn out 4 guide dogs a year. He said that of 90 applicants for guide dogs received by one agency, 42 received the animals.

He appeared in behalf of a guide dog program of the Redondo Beach Lions club, and asked for Torrance support for the program. He was introduced by Dr. Don C. Moshos.

First Vice President Rollin R. Smith presided over the meeting, and Capt. Robert Ecton, of Torrance Army hospital, presented a piano solo.

SEALED PROPOSALS will be received at the office of the City Clerk, City Hall, Torrance, California, until 8:00 o'clock p.m. on Tuesday, October 23rd, 1945, at which time they will be publicly opened and read, for performing work as follows:

Furnishing and placing approximately 2220 tons of Asphaltic Plant-Mix resurfacing materials, average thickness one and one-half inches (1 1/2"), upon the following streets:

(a) Approximately 610 tons on Arlington Avenue, between Lincoln Avenue and Sepulveda Boulevard.
(b) Approximately 350 tons on Arlington Avenue, between Border Avenue and 300 ft. north of Dominguez Street.
(c) Approximately 630 tons on Andreo Avenue, between Carson Street and 222nd Street.
(d) Approximately 630 tons on Gramercy Avenue, between Carson Street and 222nd Street.

Preparation of subgrade and reshaping of gutters will all be performed by City day labor forces and equipment.

Contractor to place surfacing materials as and when directed by City Engineer.

Bids must be made on special proposal form furnished by the City Engineer and must be accompanied by cash, certified or cashier's check, or bidder's bond, payable to City of Torrance, for an amount equal to at least ten (10%) percent of the amount bid.

All bids to be compared on basis of City Engineer's estimates.

All bidders must be licensed as per Chapter 791, Statutes of 1929, as amended.

Specifications and form of proposal may be obtained at the office of the City Engineer, City Hall, upon payment of \$1.00.

The City Council reserves the right to reject any or all bids, and to take all bids under advisement for not to exceed thirty (30) days after date of opening thereof.
