ORDINANCE NO. 365
AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE, CALIFORNIA, DECLARING THE INTENTION OF SAID CITY COUNCIL OF SAID CITY OF TORRANCE TO CALL AN ELECTION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT ACT OF 1935 IN THAT PART OF THE CITY CONTAINED WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF THE PROPOSED MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT TO BE KNOWN AS "MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT NO. 1 OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE," FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE ELECTORS OF SAID DISTRICT THE PROPOSITION OF AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF BONDS OF SAID DISTRICT AND FIXING AND GIVING NOTICE OF HEARINGS.

WHEREAS, a petition was filed in the office of the City Clerk of the City of Torrance on October 29, 1945, requesting that proceedings be taken in pursuance of an act of the legislature of the State of California, entitled "An act to provide for the formation of districts within municipalities for the acquisition, construction or extension of water works, water systems or water distribution systems; for the issuance, sale and payment of bonds of such districts to meet the cost of such water works, water systems or water distribution systems; and for the acquisition, construction or extension of such water works, water systems or water distribution systems" approved April 26, 1935 for the formation of Municipal Water District No. 1 of the City of Torrance; and WHEREAS, said petition was properly verified and the genuineness and sufficiency of the signatures thereto has been certified to by the City Clerk, and WHEREAS, the public interest and necessity require that proceedings be taken as requested in said petition:

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Torrance, California, does ordain as follows:
 SECTION 1. That it is the intention of the City Council of the City of Torrance to call an election in that certain proposed Municipal Water District No. 1 of the City of Torrance, having boundaries as hereinafter described, or as the same may be modified in the manner provided in the aforesaid Act, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of said district the proposition of authorizing the issuance and sale of bonds of such district in the manner prescribed in said Act and for the purpose of creating an indebtedness to be represented by the bonds of said district, which proceeds from the sale of which shall be used to pay the cost and expenses of acquiring and constructing the water works generally described in Section 3 hereof.

SECTION 2. That the exterior boundaries of said Municipal Water District, which shall be known as "Municipal Water District No. 1 of the City of Torrance," are described as follows:
 Beginning at a point in the south boundary of the City of Torrance at the southeast corner of Tract No. 10306, as shown on map recorded in Book 179, Pages 12 and 14 of Maps, Records of Los Angeles County, California; thence northerly along the easterly line of said Tract No. 10306, along the easterly line of Tract No. 10304 as shown on map recorded in Book 169, Pages 37 to 41 of said Maps, along the easterly line of Tract 10302 as shown on map recorded in Book 149, Pages 97 to 100 of said Maps, and along the easterly line of Tract 10300 as shown on map recorded in Book 146, Pages 86 to 89 of said Maps, and its northerly prolongation to a corner in the boundary line of the City of Torrance; thence northerly along said city boundary line to a corner therein; thence easterly along said city boundary line and the easterly prolongation thereof to a point in the southerly line of Sepulveda Boulevard; thence easterly along the southerly line of Sepulveda Boulevard in its various courses to the northeast corner of Tract No. 2200, as shown on map recorded in Book 26, Pages 19 and 20 of said Maps; thence southerly along the easterly line of said Tract No. 2200 to the north-west corner of Tract No. 397, as shown on map recorded in Book 14, Page 112 of said Maps; thence southerly along the westerly boundary of said Tract No. 397 to a corner in the boundary line of the City of Torrance; thence following

along said city boundary line in its various courses southerly, westerly, southerly, westerly, and southerly to the southeast corner of Tract No. 9768 as shown on map recorded in Book 170, Pages 10 to 12 of said Maps; thence continuing along the said city boundary line westerly, northwesterly, and westerly to the point of beginning. (In all places in which the boundary line of the City of Torrance is mentioned or referred to in this description, the line so mentioned or referred to is the boundary line of the city as the same existed on October 1, 1945, and all references to Maps, Books, or records in said description refer to records of Los Angeles County, California, on file in the office of the County Recorder of said County.)

That a map showing the exterior boundaries of said district, with relation to the territory immediately contiguous thereto, and a general description of the proposed water works are on file in the office of the City Clerk of the City of Torrance, which said map shall govern for all details as to the extent of said district.

SECTION 3. That a general description of the water works proposed to be acquired and constructed is as follows, to wit: the acquisition and construction of water works, for supplying said district and the inhabitants thereof with water for domestic, agricultural, industrial or other purposes; said water works to consist of a water supply main extending along Pacific Coast Highway from the water main of the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California at Walnut Street and Pacific Coast Highway to approximately the westerly line of Lot 8, Meadow Park Tract, as shown on map recorded in Book 15, Page 80, Miscellaneous Records of Los Angeles County, California; the acquisition of an existing water distribution system (sometimes called the Quandt system) in said district, and the reconstruction of certain distribution lines thereof; the acquisition and construction of additional water distribution mains; and the acquisition and construction along the water distribution lines of fire hydrants, meters, and appurtenant work.

SECTION 4. That the estimated cost of said proposed water works is the sum of one hundred and fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000.00), and the estimated amount of the incidental expense in connection therewith is the sum of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000.00). That an election will be held in said district on January 15, 1946, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of said district the proposition of incurring an indebtedness, by the issuance of bonds of such district in the principal sum of one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000.00), to pay the cost and expenses of said proposed water works.

SECTION 5. That the 18th day of December, 1945, at the hour of eight o'clock P. M. in the Council Chambers in the City Hall, in the City of Torrance, California, is hereby fixed as the date, hour and place for the hearing of protests, which shall be in writing and filed with the Clerk of said City Council at or before said time of hearing, as provided for by said Act.

SECTION 6. That the City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this ordinance and cause the same to be published one week for two weeks in the Torrance Herald, a newspaper published less than six days per week in the City of Torrance. This ordinance shall take effect upon the completion of said publication.

The foregoing prevailing wage schedule is based upon a working day of eight hours, and in the event that laborers, workmen or mechanics are employed less than eight hours per day, the rate of pay shall be proportionately reduced so that the fraction of the foregoing rates that the number of hours of employment bears to eight hours. Each bid must be in duplicate and accompanied by a certified cashier's check in the sum of \$1,000.00, which check to be made payable to the Board of Supervisors as a guarantee that the bidder, if successful, will enter into a contract satisfactory to said Board, and in addition thereto the successful bidder will be required to furnish and maintain bonds for the faithful performance of the contract and the payment of laborers' wages.
