


### Milo Clifford Dies Of Hit-Run Injuries

Milo Clifford, 55-year-old resident of Channel Heights, who last Wednesday was the victim of a hit and run driver on Pacific Coast highway near Western ave., died Monday morning in the San Pedro hospital.

Witnesses said that Clifford was hurled more than 35 feet when struck by a speeding automobile, suffering concussions, severe shock, compound fractures of the leg and internal injuries, San Pedro doctors said.

The driver of the death car has not yet been apprehended, police said. Fred Bobo, 24606 Narbonne ave., reported that he had given chase to the car for several blocks but lost it as it whipped around a corner. It was described as a dark green sedan.

### Exemption Blanks For Welfare Groups On Hand

County Assessor John R. Quinn announced today that forms on which the new welfare exemption of taxes may be claimed are now available at Room 401, Hall of Justice building.

Hospitals, religious and charitable organizations and veterans' groups chartered by congress are eligible for the exemptions under a new state law which will become effective 1946-47.

The assessor stated that the affidavits claiming a welfare exemption must be filed with his office between the first Monday in March and not later than 5 p.m. April 1.
