**Government Career Service Offered To Vets**

Opportunity for a career service with the state government opened today when Frederick White, Department of Employment representative in the public employment office at 1622 Cravena ave, announced forms are available for filling to take the forthcoming civil service examinations for Unemployment Insurance Claims Examiners. 'Christ' is defined as, 'The divine manifestation of God, which comes to the flesh to destroy inanimate error.'"
