'All Out' Campaign To Find Jobs For Veterans Launched In Torrance

An "all-out" campaign to find suitable jobs for local veterans, displaced war workers and other job applicants, will be launched beginning Wednesday, March 21st, and continuing until April 30th, K. E. Bradley, local USES manager, announced.

Cooperating in the program is the Torrance Area Veterans Service Center, of which J. J. Caldwell is director, the Veterans of Foreign Wars, the American Legion and their auxiliaries, and the whole program has the endorsement of the Torrance Chamber of Commerce and various service organizations.

"This is part of a nationwide campaign to create jobs, especially for veterans. With the many returning veterans coming to our office for help and advice, there is an urgent need for all employers to file all their job openings with us," Bradley said.

"Applications for employment by returning veterans in this area increased approximately 50 percent in the past month. The task of local USES office is to match the worker and the job. This can be done only if every employer, large or small, lists his job openings at the local USES office."

Bradley said that every businessman will be canvassed for job openings. A special effort will be made to "find jobs and fill jobs."
