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3,781,596 Voters Eligible In California

California's current voting registration is 3,781,596, a drop of 359,735 under the presidential general election in November of 1944 but 416,613 greater than for the consolidated primary of two years ago, it was announced today by Frank M. Jordan, Secretary of State.

Jordan's figures showed 2,179,996 registered as Democrats; 1,426,493, Republicans; 6,176, Prohibition; 6,469 miscellaneous; 182,432 declined to state.

Plans For Metropolitan Freeways Discussed With Legislative Body

Plans for a co-ordinated freeway program in the metropolitan area were presented to a legislative committee of the Legislature here this week.

The legislative group hearing plan is the Joint Fact-Finding Committee on Highways, Streets and Bridges, headed by Senator Randolph Collier of Yreka.

Mayor Fletcher Bowron welcomed the committee at its first session at 10 a.m. Monday at the State Building. Neil Petree, chairman of the Metropolitan Traffic and Transit Committee, reviewed plans for the week's program, and P. G. Winnett, business executive, long prominent in civic planning, pointed out area needs for early completion of the freeway program.

for committee hearings, included statements from representatives of other cities in the county Monday afternoon, and a week-long series of reports by experts from city, county and civic groups.

Tuesday morning hearing included a report on parking by Samuel Leask, Jr., California Retailers Association president; Mahlon E. Arnett, Los Angeles Downtown Parking Association president; and Carl Bush, Downtown Business Men's Association assistant general manager; a report on street traffic by Ralph T. Dorsey, city traffic engineer, and statements on the safety factor found in freeways by J. W. Vickrey, state highway division safety engineer; E. E. East, Automobile Club of Southern California chief engineer, and Col. F. C. Lynch, Greater Los Angeles Safety Council secretary-manager.

Raymond V. Darby, county supervisor, discussed the county's highway financing since 1923 on Tuesday afternoon. He was aided by O. Cooley, county road commissioner, George Terhune and Walter Thiel of the City Bureau of Budget and Efficiency, and Dan Hoye, city controller.

A final session will be held Friday afternoon, at which the committee will ask further questions of all participants and the program will be summed up by Chairman Petree.
