

### W. H. Tolson Top Man In Three Past Elections

1937, and served until the end of this term.

In a hotly contested election, again with a large field, Tolson in 1940 suffered the only defeat of his career.

However, he came back in 1944, and on April 11 of that year he again was elected to the City Council receiving the highest number of points of any candidate. He was elected mayor on April 18, 1944, and served until Tuesday night when an unexpected political maneuver placed Councilman J. Hugh Sherfey in the mayor's chair.

**Cooperation Pledge**  
Yesterday he pledged cooperation to the new mayor.

"I will help Mayor Sherfey in any way I can," Tolson said. "After all, the interests of the City of Torrance are the first to be considered. The question of who is to be mayor is of secondary consideration. We need a progressive, and harmonious city government, and I, for one, will do all that I can to see that Torrance has just such a government."

He has spearheaded the post-war planning program for the City of Torrance, which includes the several major projects which will be placed before the voters at an election this summer.

Active in aviation affairs, he has been largely responsible for the progress made to date toward securing for Torrance the army airport on 101 highway.

Tolson has taken a lead in the several water expansion programs now in the process of formation in several sections of Torrance, and had formulated plans to lead to the service of all areas of Torrance with sanitary sewers.

Councilman Tolson, in his capacity as mayor, has been serving on the County Sanitation District No. 5 board of directors, and this task will be transferred to Mayor Sherfey, it was indicated.

He is on the committee on governmental efficiency of the Los Angeles County Division of the California League of Cities. A veteran of World War I, he is a member of both the Veterans of Foreign Wars and the American Legion, Torrance posts.

Residing at the family home, 913 Beech ave., Councilman and Mrs. Tolson are the parents of two sons, Robert Tolson having served in World War II as a Naval air lieutenant, and Billy, a student of Torrance high school.

He is a member of Torrance Baptist church and of the Board of Directors of the Baptist Bible College of Torrance.

He is a member of Torrance Aviation Commission and Torrance Rotary club, and is engaged in the real estate, insurance and loan business.

fore he stepped from the chair to permit City Clerk Bartlett to conduct the election, had paid high tribute to Councilman J. E. Hitchcock, senior member of the council who retired after 14 years of continuous service Tuesday night.

"It is not going to be the same without him," Tolson said of Hitchcock. "As far as I am concerned, Jim has been a real asset to the council and the city."

Later in the meeting, Councilman Powell paid a similar tribute to Councilman N. H. Cucci, who also retired, not having been a candidate for reelection. "Councilman Cucci," Powell said, "has given four years of honest and faithful service to the people of Torrance."

Councilman Jackson said that he would do all that he could for Torrance to the best of his ability and thanked the people for the honor bestowed upon him in electing him to office.

Bartlett likewise expressed his thanks to the people for their faith and trust in him as city clerk, and Mrs. Margaret Fordice, installed as city treasurer, expressed her appreciation for the vote in her favor.

The oath of office was administered to Bartlett by Deputy City Clerk I. J. Hallanger, and Bartlett in turn swore in Sherfey, Jackson and Mrs. Fordice. The auditorium was filled to capacity.

R. L. Plomert Jr. expressed the willingness of the Torrance Chamber of Commerce to cooperate with the City Council in all matters. Plomert, vice president of the chamber, acted in the absence of the city of Reed H. Parkin, president.

Joel Hagberg gave notice of similar cooperation on the part of the Walteria Civic Association.
