Los Angeles City Council Opines Occupation Tax

The revenue and taxation committee of the Los Angeles city council has decided that the new occupation tax should be either repealed outright or made to apply only to occupations listed in the ordinance.

The tax is intended to apply to independent contractors, doctors, lawyers and other non-salaried occupations. But Chairman John Roden, of the 13th district, said there had been much confusion about exactly what occupations are to be taxed. He said the committee would get an opinion from the city attorney and would make a definite recommendation to the city council Thursday as to whether the tax ordinance should be repealed or amended.

The tax was intended to raise about one million dollars annually for Los Angeles.

Airport Operators Agree To Lower Power Lines

Recommendation to the Board of Supervisors was made by Regional Planning Commission recently in favor of granting an airport license to A. L. Sharp and A. B. Stoddard, who are now operating the Gardena Valley Airport on Western avenue north of Rosemead, on the condition that Sharp remove or lower power lines on the east boundary of his property. Agreeing to comply with that request, Sharp said the Board of Supervisors would give final consideration to the license, soon.
