

Disputed Track Meet Will Be Settled Today

Due to an intentional foul in the mile, Narbonne and San Pedro high schools battled to a 48-46 score last Friday on the Gauchos oval.

Today's mile will decide who is Marine League dual meet champion and will go a long way toward determining 1946 track champs. Jack Knibb and Gil Lara are about an even choice to hit the tape first, while Lincoln Gillespie and possibly Jack Ackerman will take third. A first for Lara will give the meet to Narbonne by three points. If San Pedro takes first and third, they win by 1 point. By taking second and third the Gauchos can win by one point.

McDaniels of the Pirates took both hurdles races easily. Kris Janicich and Cork Richardson followed McDaniels across the finish.

In the expected 880 dual, Flores sprinted by Miller in the far turn and won in 2:11.4.

John Moffitt won the 100 over Derriek and Garrison. Lynn Danks was disqualified for jumping the gun too many times.

A clean sweep in the pole vault gave Narbonne a much needed 9 points. Dave Downard and Jack Ackerman tied for first.

Jerry Zuvola leaped 21' 1" and Bill Brown went 21' as Zuvola won the broad jump by the thin margin of 1 inch.

Clyde Garrison sprinted all the way from the turn to take the 440 followed by Fred Ihde, Derriek and Danks of San Pedro followed Moffitt across the line in the 220 yard race.

Bob Hilton took a double in the shot and high jump to become the second double winner of the day.

San Pedro took a long lead in the relay and Derriek held on as Moffitt closed the gap in the final 220 yards.

BANK OF AMERICA INCREASES PAY OF ITS WORKERS

Bank of America's Torrance employees will benefit from higher pay and shorter hours soon, the bank announced today.

War-time hours and pay will be replaced by new schedules July 1. Hours will be cut to 40, and the 15 per cent war-time extra pay for longer hours will give way to these changes: 30 per cent increases for salaries up to \$200 a month; \$60 a month increase for \$200-\$333 salaries; \$50 a month increase for \$333-\$500 bracket.

Chairman A. P. Giannini said the bank's directors had been considering the "white collar worker" predicament for more than a year before deciding on the revisions to meet the cost of living rise.
