He was one of the organizers of the Associated Oil Co. and served as its president from 1902 to 1910, and a member of the firm of Chanslor-Canfield-Midway Oil Co., holders of heavy Torrance interests. He resigned as a director of Tidewater Associated Oil Co. last year.


