### Riley Backing Kuchel For Controller

Burke Riley, son of former State Controller Harry B. Riley and an assistant to his father at the time the latter died last February, has thrown his support in the June primaries to State Controller Thomas H. Kuchel.

Riley, who today revealed that he had been urged to enter the June primaries and make the race for the office his father so successfully administered, said he turned down the suggestion because he believed it would be "trading" on his father's name.

"But," commented the younger Riley, "I guess some people do not have the same moral scruples. A Harry E. Riley from South Gate and of whom I never heard, is running for State Controller and using the phrase 'your state controller' on some of his campaign literature. That sounds to me like an attempt to hoodwink the voters into believing they still are voting for my father.

"I would not run for Controller because I feared I would be trading on my father's name and because I believe sincerely that the man who should be elected to that office is State Controller Thomas H. Kuchel. Kuchel in truth is your state controller. He was appointed on my father's death. He is a trained public official. He is a man with whom my father worked and who had my father's complete confidence.

"I know that my late father, who had the confidence of California's voters, would back Thomas H. Kuchel to the limit as I am backing him and I know that my father would be the first to resent the attempt of any other candidate to trade on a family name."

**THESE HONORED DEAD**—Honors and benefits given a veteran for having served his country in the time of war, follow him even after death.

The flag which covers his casket, funeral expenses, burial plot, marker and perpetual care of his grave are furnished by a grateful country for which he fought.

He is not forgotten, no matter how far from home and loved ones he lies buried. Wreaths are placed on his grave, comrades fire salutes, prayers are offered for him. As long as this nation continues to exist his "final resting place" will be marked and honored.

To save confusion and needless delay at the time of bereavement **RIGHT GUIDE** offers the following information to both veterans and their families.

**Question:** Who are eligible for burial in a VA cemetery?

**Answer:** Veterans of any war with "an other than dishonorable discharge."

**Question:** What procedures do next in kin follow to have a veteran buried in a VA cemetery?

**Answer:** If death occurs while a veteran is receiving hospital care at government expense a funeral clerk with offices in the hospital will make such arrangements as requested by next of kin. Available services include: mortuary casket, pall bearers, firing squad, chapel, chaplain and transportation from chapel to cemetery. Substitutions may be made. If government contract services are not desired, reimbursement for burial expenditures not exceeding \$100 will be allowed. If interment is requested elsewhere the remains will be shipped anywhere within the continental limits of the United States at government expense.

Private funeral homes are aware of procedures, and will make arrangements, if death occurs to a veteran not being hospitalized at government expense. After memorial services have been held in the home of private mortuary, friends or relatives present the body to the VA cemetery for interment. Reimbursement for expenses not exceeding \$100 will be allowed.

**Question:** Is crematory service available in VA cemeteries?

**Answer:** Yes, upon signed request made by the veteran before his death or by the next in kin after his death. Each VA cemetery has a columbarium. Here again, however, regulations differ with the place of death. If death occurs to the veteran while being hospitalized at government expense he may be cremated in the VA cemetery and his ashes sent at government expense anywhere within the continental limits of the United States. For others the deceased is presented to the VA cemetery for cremation but the ashes must remain in the VA columbarium.

**Question:** How is a regulation flag obtained?

**Answer:** Upon application made to any VA office or county seat postmaster. Application must be made by the next of kin before interment of the veteran's body.

**LT. GOV. HOUSER**

 SUPERIOR JUDGE

Lieutenant Governor Frederick F. Houser, who is a candidate for Judge of the Superior Court of Los Angeles County, has the vigorous endorsement of the Los Angeles (city and county) Bar Association, because of the heavy majority vote given him in the Association's ballot poll of all the county's 6,000 lawyers and judges.

### Chief Of State Airport Planning Staff Announced

Governor Earl Warren has announced the appointment of Colonel Warren E. Carey of Los Angeles as Chief of the State Master Airport Planning Staff of the State Reconstruction and Reemployment Commission. Colonel Carey will direct a study of ways in which this state can take advantage of the \$18,000,000 allocated to California under U.S. Senate Bill No. 2, just signed by President Truman.

The appointment of Colonel Carey, whose military service in the Air Corps covers both World Wars and who is a national authority on airports and air safety, follows action by the State Reconstruction and Reemployment Commission requesting that \$40,000 be provided from the emergency fund for developing the Master Airport Plan.

The Commission pointed out that this plan became essential in the relationship between the Federal Government, Civil Air Administration, Civil Aeronautics Board and local units of government to make California eligible to receive and use the \$18,000,000 of Federal funds for airport development under the new legislation.
