**GONE WITH THE WIND . . .** About the time Captain Louis Zamperini was nervously saying, "I Do," to the lovely Cynthia Applewhite, young Bob McMullen of Cathedral high school threw another log on the fire during the State High School meet Saturday at Compton to outgun his nearest rival in the home-stretch of the mile and hang up a new record of 4m. 28.8s, set during the 1934 State meet at Berkeley.



A week prior to setting his fallen mark at Berkeley, Zamperini had run in the Southern California meet in the Los Angeles Coliseum and set a world high school record for the mile with 4m. 21.2s. This still stands.


