Area War Chest, Community Chest Are Merged For Coming Campaign

A merger of Los Angeles Area War Chest and the Community Chest was effected by nearly 1000 representative citizens, voluntary leaders in patriotic and charitable campaigns, who met on Monday last noon (May 27) in the Biltmore Bowl. The newly formed organization is known as the Welfare Federation of the Los Angeles Area.

Within the organization will be more than 8500 men and women, including 3000 founder members and board of directors of the War Chest, Community Chest leadership, industrial, professional and labor groups, known as Community Welfare Associates of the newly formed Federation, who will give continuing support to Los Angeles area health and welfare agencies.

Neil Petree, president of the War Chest, which was formally dissolved at the meeting, emphasized that volunteer efforts must be coordinated if all those requiring aid in the 750 square miles served by the Federation were to be efficiently served, especially as the Los Angeles area now faces the greatest and most rapid expansion of any metropolitan area in the country.

P. G. Winnett, president of Community Welfare Federation, urged that all worthy causes of national and international scope which contemplate fund-raising in the Los Angeles area be asked to present their cases for study and inclusion in the annual Community Chest campaign.

"If the people of the Los Angeles area approve of federated fund-raising to support its health and welfare agencies through the one campaign a year of the Community Chest," Winnett said, "we will have to maintain the war time standard of giving. This is a decision that can only be made by the tens of thousands of volunteers and contributors from the 35 associated towns and cities. We cannot force anyone to join in federated finance, but we can hold the door open if they will present their cases for study, and inclusion in the annual Chest campaign."
