### Slight Price Rise For Los Angeles Area Is Reported

Prices of living essentials in the Los Angeles area rose slightly (by 0.2 percent) between March 15 and April 15, Charles A. Roumasset, economist for the Bureau of Labor Statistics, announced here today.

Higher average prices for household furnishings (up 0.7 percent over the month) included increased costs for living room sets and higher prices for sheets and brooms. With this month's increase, consumers are paying 45 percent more for household furnishings than they did in the prewar (1935-39) years and 22 percent more than in April 1943.

Increased costs of soap, newspapers and toilet paper were mainly responsible for a rise of 0.3 percent in the miscellaneous goods and services index. This index is now 30 percent above the 1935-39 base period and 12 percent higher than the April 1943 level. Fuel costs, now 2 percent lower than they were in April 1943 and more than 7 percent below the prewar level. Rents were not surveyed in April.

**Potatoes, Cereal Suggested As Bread Substitute**  
In order to make wheat available for famine relief, use potatoes, oatmeal, cornmeal and other cereals, suggests Mrs. Margaret Todt, home demonstration agent for the Agricultural Extension service in Los Angeles County.

Forly percent reduction of wheat products by all householders is urged by the President's famine Emergency committee, she says, offering suggestions based on United States Department of Agriculture nutrition studies.

### Housing Need Progress Is Disclosed

Details of the rapid progress made by the State Government in providing emergency means for relieving the critical housing situation in California are contained in a report made to Governor Earl Warren by A. Earl Washburn, State Director of Reconstruction and Reemployment.

Washburn pointed out that under the emergency housing legislation adopted at the special session of the Legislature which ended two months ago, 39 percent of the \$7,500,000 appropriated to aid cities, colleges and local housing authorities has been allocated as the State's share in setting up Army, Navy and Federal public housing which is being erected for emergency use by veterans and their families. He also reported on progress made in providing housing in the San Francisco Bay area.

He said: "Through its Department of Finance, the State Government has made available to cities, colleges and local housing authorities a total of \$2,925,682 of the \$7,500,000 appropriated by the Legislature at the session which ended last February. This is the total to May 1.

"Applications have been received by the Department of Finance from 35 local agencies and 19 more agencies are in communication with the Department in preparation for filing their applications. The total number of family units covered in the applications already made to the Department is 4,447.

"Up to April 30, the total allocated of the State's money was \$2,574,802.
