At Summer Camp**

Final details are being completed for the opening of Camp Paivika, summer camp for crippled children, conducted by the Crippled Children's Society of Los Angeles County.

Camp Paivika is the only camp for crippled children west of Mississippi. It is situated on Brookside Lane, Crestline Village, one mile from the shores of Lake Gregory, in the Bernardino mountains, and will open June 26 with a group of physically handicapped young people from fifteen to twenty-one years of age.

Many children who were at the camp last year experienced for the first time the thrill of sleeping under the stars and planets; of learning to swim, studying nature at first hand, relaxing around a glowing camp fire, finding new hobbies and developing many handicraft skills in ceramics, basket weaving and plastic jewelry.

The camp has been made possible partly through the funds raised by the sale of Easter seals, which the public so generously supported, in addition to contributions made specifically for the camp's operation.

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
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
