"I am a veteran of World War I. Am I entitled to any benefits now?"

Answer: Yes, you are entitled to several benefits. They are outlined here for your information. It would be impossible to make a detailed explanation of each. However, if you are interested it is suggested you call at your nearest V.A. office.

Hospitalization or Domiciliary Care. This includes emergency or extended hospital treatment if you are incapacitated from earning a living and have no adequate means of support.

Pension for Permanent and Total Disability. Not Service Connected. This benefit is not paid when disability is due to veteran's own willful misconduct. Your income is a factor.

Outpatients Treatment. You are entitled to outpatients treatment for service connected disability. This law is the same as applies to World War II veterans. In California you may receive such treatment from any member of the California Physicians' Service. Procedures will be explained to you at any V.A. office.

U. S. Government Life Insurance (USGI). You may obtain USGI in any of its forms provided you served between Oct. 1, 1917, and July 2, 1921, and can show good health. The amount cannot exceed \$10,000.

Physical examinations will be made free at any V.A. regional office or center where a full-time doctor is employed.

Reinstatement of USGI. Your USGI may be reinstated providing your policy was not surrendered for cash, and providing you pay all premiums in arrears with 5 percent interest. Extended term insurance may be reinstated, under certain conditions, without physical examination.

Civil Service Preference. Five percent for war service, additional five percent if you have disability pension. In a circular letter dated June 14, 1946, General Bradley said, "All things being equal, no distinction should be made between World War I and World War II veterans" in filling V.A. positions.

Widow's Pension. Widows, parents and minor children are entitled to pension upon the death of a veteran of World War I. If death occurs from service connected disability, income of beneficiary has no bearing. Widows and minor children (not parents) are entitled to pension even though death is not service connected. In these cases annual income has bearing.

Burial Expense. A burial allowance in the amount of \$100 is allowed for burial, funeral expense, traveling expenses. Regulation burial flag may be issued and given the next of kin after interment. All war veterans may be buried in a National or V.A. cemetery free of cost. His discharge must be "other than dishonorable."

Port Hueneme Veterans Sale Due July 15

Uncle Sam's big war surplus "department store" at the Port Hueneme Naval Base near Oxnard, into which is pouring shiploads of military equipment and supplies from overseas, prepared for a 12 1/2 million-dollar sale opening to veterans July 15, and to non-priority buyers on July 29.


This will be the first of a series of "cycle" sales thru which \$100,000,000 worth of surplus is expected to be routed into civilian channels of trade and industry by the end of the year, according to the announcement by Serge P. Ballif Jr., regional director of the War Assets Administration.

The second cycle sale, Ballif said, will begin for veterans on July 23, or just a week after the first, and will involve an additional inventory valued at between \$3,000,000 and \$4,000,000. Sales are to be started weekly for an indefinite period with an average of a million dollars worth of surplus, offered each succeeding week. The various sales will continue simultaneously until the merchandise is sold.

On sale beginning July 15 will be such items as wire and cable, gaskets, lead, dough mixers, dericks, cranes, hoists, pumps, spray outfits, circular saws, welders, laundry equipment, greasing equipment, tanks, sirens, landing mat mesh, boilers, shapers, steel bridges, generators, awning frames, canvas water bags, tents, steel beds, canvas cots.
