

Shoestring Strip Needs Attention, Writer Declares

(Editor's note: People of the shoestring strip of Los Angeles, bordering along the Western avenue boundary of Torrance, should be justly proud of the progress they have made in the absence of the municipal services which go to make up the "big city" of which they actually are a part. Torrance considers the district an important part of this community, but finds itself in the unfortunate position of being unable under the law to provide the police, fire, public health, recreation and street work to which the area is entitled. The following article was prepared by a resident of the district to give the viewpoint of property owners there and is printed in the hope that it will gain the official recognition to which this area is entitled, together with the help in its problems which it might inspire among local organizations.)

Very few communities have grown as fast and as steadily as the residential section located east of Torrance. This area, generally known as the "shoestring strip," has jumped in recent years from a few hundred homes to the present 2500.

Eighty-five percent of the residents of the area, middle-class people, are home owners. The majority are workers employed by nearby factories, refineries and rubber plants.

Like all communities, the needs grow as fast as the community grows. The most important need at the present time is a suitable outlet for children's activities, a playground for example. On one street, four adjoining lots have been cleared and graded by

Supervisors Turn Down Stadium Plea

For the second time the board of supervisors Tuesday turned down an application for authority to construct a sports stadium and midget auto race track on a 40-acre site on the north side of Carson st. between Alameda st. and Wilmington ave. in the town of Dominguez.

The denial was voted on the motion of Supervisor Raymond V. Darby, who previously favored the amusement development.

He pointed out that conditions have since changed by the establishment of a similar project, including a race track at Gardena.

The application for the Dominguez project was presented by Ware and Crosley Associated Enterprises of Long Beach.

The first time the application came before the supervisors several weeks ago it was voted down by a vote of 3 to 2, with Darby casting his vote for approval.

A baseball diamond was laid out. Thus far, no equipment has been added.

A group of residents have organized and are endeavoring to create enough interest to warrant help in securing baseballs, bats, volley balls and basket balls. A sand pile and swings are needed for the youngsters.

The fact that there is no known record of juvenile delinquency on the shoestring strip may be as clean as it is. The playground is a protective and health-building measure.

As the area is entirely residential, there are no clubs or business men's organizations. No funds are solicited nor are any wanted. While the strip is a part of Los Angeles, it is really a community of Torrance. The people are a part of the social and business life of Torrance. They constitute a large part of the buying power, attend the schools and churches and look to Torrance for their banking and medical needs.

These people are well named as they are on the "shoestring" when in need of help that a community of this size usually enjoys.

Mary Lee Taylor's Meat and Potato Salad Broadcast August 3, 1946

2 tablespoons finely cut onion
2 1/2 cups diced, cooked potatoes
2 tablespoons meat drippings
2 tablespoons flour
1 tablespoon sugar
1/4 teaspoon dry mustard
1 1/2 teaspoons salt
1/2 cup vinegar
Cook onion slowly 5 min. in drippings. Blend in mixture of flour, sugar, mustard, salt and pepper. Stir in mixture of vinegar and water. Simmer and boil slowly 2 min. Remove from heat; stir into milk. Mix in remaining ingredients. Garnish with hard-cooked egg slices and strips of pickles, if desired. Serves 4.
