NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the City Council of the City of Torrance, California, will open on Tuesday, the 13th day of August, 1946, receive sealed bids for furnishing said city with all amounts of gasoline which may be required by said city, including Municipal Improvement District No. 1, during the period commencing July 1, 1946 and ending June 30, 1947.

The estimated amount of gasoline which will be required by said city and Municipal Improvement District No. 1 during such period is 146,000 gallons; but said figure is an estimate only. Bidders in bidding shall state the unit price per gallon which will be charged for such gasoline.

The contract to be awarded hereunder will provide that all of the city's requirements for gasoline will be purchased during the said period from the successful bidder at the unit price indicated in the bid of such successful bidder whatever the amount required may be.
