

Preparations Complete For Sheriff's Rodeo

Climaxing weeks of preparation, everything is in readiness to make the Sheriff's big rodeo on Sunday afternoon, Aug. 25, at the Coliseum, the most spectacular thrill-packed show of its kind ever to be staged on the West Coast.

Republic star Roy Rogers, the King of Cowboys, and his wonder horse, Trigger, known as the "smartest horse in the movies," will head the great roster of noted performers. Universal star, glamorous Yvonne de Carlo, who will reign as Queen of the Rodeo and head the procession of celebrities from the many studios who will take part in this great event. Gregory Peck, star of Selznick Pictures, will be on hand to award trophies to contest winners.

At the personal invitation of Sheriff Eugene W. Biscailuz, the finest trick riders and ropers from the National Charro Association of Mexico City are flying here to participate in "friendly across the border" competition with our American cowboys.

This will mark the first time that members of the National Charro Association from Mexico City have come to Los Angeles to perform.

One of the most noted horsewomen of Mexico, Rosita Lopez, will ride in this spectacular grand entry parade.

Championship titles in the five major rodeo arena events are expected to top with the nation's number one cowhands set to participate in the more than \$2,500 prize money. Many thrills are expected in the bare-back bronc riding, saddle bronc riding and Brahma steer riding contests. Andy Jauregui of Newhall has received a fresh stock of wild Brahma bulls and bucking horses from Arizona and Wyoming especially for these events.

More than 700 of the most colorful western horses and riders will take part in the grand entry parade, opening festivities of the day.

Care Asked Due To Forest Fire Hazard Months

With the number of forest fires soaring over the 3,500 mark for the first seven-month period of 1946, the State Division of Forestry, in cooperation with the State Department of Agriculture and the Chamber of Commerce, has today issued a new fire prevention appeal to Californians and the state's visitors who are daily burning more than 8,000 acres of our timber and watershed lands. A fire danger warning leaflet is being distributed by the Department of Agriculture border quarantine stations to each newcomer in California, emphasizing the hazardous condition of our roadside areas and asking that cigarettes, matches and cigars be extinguished before being discarded.

"Roadside fires, caused by cigarettes and matches," DeWitt Nelson, the state's forester, said in explaining this appeal, "have this year accounted for 20% of our forest and watershed fires. We are using every available means to reduce this high percentage, and it is hoped that these leaflets will be read and digested by the thousands of visitors passing through the border checking stations each month."

According to Nelson, August, September and October are the three worst months for forest fires in California because of high temperatures, low humidities, strong winds and low fuel moisture. If the loss from fire to timber and watershed lands is to be decreased this year, every traveller on California roads must cooperate by using the car ashtray instead of the car window when disposing of that match, cigarette or cigar.
