### Bernard Donahue Is Appointed New Vice Principal

For the first time in the history of Torrance high school, a boys' vice principal has been appointed. The appointee is Bernard J. Donahue, who is well known to many residents in Torrance.

Donahue originally came to Torrance in 1932 and left in 1937. He served under Arthur Waidelich and Thomas Elson. Head of the physical education department at Hamilton high school, Los Angeles, in the fall of 1937, he coached varsity football and baseball. In 1946 Donahue was made substitute vice principal at Banning high school, Wilmington, and there gave up his position to a returning veteran.

The new vice principal graduated from Loyola in 1930, when he earned letters in football, basketball and baseball. He has done graduate work in education at U.S.C.

While at Torrance high school he founded the honor organization known as the Tartar Knights. On two occasions his football teams played in the Coliseum. On those occasions the Torrance varsity football team represented the Marine league. His star athlete in those days was Captain Louis Zamperini.

Donahue, who is married, and schoolmen as "Bernie," said he is pleased with the opportunity of helping build up for the new Torrance school system the finest student body and athletic teams. The Donahues have lived at Hermosa Beach for many years.

Years ago, under the W.P.A. setup, he organized the Torrance Recreation department, now under the supervision of Dale Riley.

### Vanderlip Pushing Palos Verdes Site For Academy; Del Monte Favored

While hopes for establishment of the West Coast U.S. Naval Academy in Southern California have been more or less abandoned, Lomita Flight Strip and Palos Verdes came in for consideration of the visiting Senate subcommittee seeking a site for the academy.

Torrance was one of the first California cities to file a brief suggesting a local site for the Naval Academy, prepared by Harry B. Lewis, then secretary of the Torrance Chamber of Commerce. It was praised by Rep. Cecil R. King as the finest brief of that nature submitted.

Sen. John L. McClellan, after surveying Palos Verdes sites suggested by Kelvin C. Vanderlip, president of the Palos Verdes Corp., for the academy, declared Friday that the West Coast definitely will be the site of a new post-graduate academy, but the chances are strong that it will be located at Del Monte. Accompanying Senator McClellan was Capt. H. A. Spangell, U.S.N., and Vanderlip. There were no Torrance representatives in the group, it was said.

The possibility that a harbor could be built at Portuguese Bend as part of a Navy post-graduate school at Palos Verdes was explored by Sen. John L. McClellan, head of a Senate subcommittee seeking a site for the project. It was pointed out that the school could make use of the Lomita Flight Strip for its aerial activities.

The academy, he said, will accommodate 3,000 to 3,500 graduates of the Annapolis Naval Academy, with four to six years' service. It will include an air base.
