Dominguez Rancho Battle Subject Of Commemoration

One of the most important historical events of Los Angeles County will be commemorated next Wednesday, Oct. 9, at 11 a.m., when the battle of the Dominguez Rancho will be recalled at public ceremonies on the battle ground site east of Torrance.

The ceremony will consist of the laying of a wreath beneath one of the three-century-old trees which suffered battle scars in the skirmishes of Oct. 8 and 9, 1846.

Supervisor Raymond V. Darby, who represents the Dominguez area, and Rev. Eugene Herran, C. M. F., rector of the Claretian Seminary which now occupies the Dominguez Rancho, will deliver tributes to the men of both sides who fought the decisive battle.

Representatives of the Native Sons of the Golden West and of various historical societies are expected to participate in the centennial observance. Honor will be paid to Manuel Dominguez, owner of the vast estate which still bears the family name.

The public may witness the event by traveling to Dominguez Junction and entering the Rancho property at 18127 S. Alameda Blvd.

10th Anniversary Of Boulder Dam To Take Civic Leaders To Nevada

Torrance will be represented in the gathering of governmental and industrial leaders headed by Secretary of the Interior J. A. Krug, which will assemble at Boulder Dam October 23 to participate in ceremonies marking the completion of ten years of power production by the Boulder Canyon project, it was announced yesterday.

Governors of the seven basin states who are primarily concerned with the development—Arizona, California, Colorado, Nevada, New Mexico, Utah and Wyoming—have been invited to take part in the occasion and, according to Earl Brothers, chairman of the Boulder Dam Power Decennial Committee, acceptances have been received from Governors Sidney P. Osborn of Arizona, Vail Pittman of Nevada and Herbert B. Maw of Utah. Chairman Brothers further stated that he has received assurances that every one of the seven states will be represented. Commissioner of Reclamation Michael Strauss has agreed to speak on the program.

Hottest Day, 95, Followed By First Rainfall Of Year

Coming on the heels of Torrance's hottest day of the year, a trace of rain fell Sunday night after the thermometer had soared to 95 degrees, and was followed by a break shower Monday night and Tuesday morning.

First real rainfall of the season, the Tuesday precipitation brought the moisture meter at the Fire Department's weather station to .30 inch. Lowest temperature registered here during the week was 59 degrees, recorded both Sept. 25 and 28.
