Headed by Joseph R. Knowland, statewide chairman, those present will include representatives of 88 county committees, six regional committees and 42 statewide sub-committees organized to handle the promotional, cultural and other phases of the celebrations.

Copies Of Book On Repatriation At Stone & Myers

Copies of "Return of Our Gold Star Heroes," first authoritative booklet on the repatriation program, have been received by Stone and Myers Mortuary, J. Hugh Sherrey, president, announced yesterday.



Crops Handling Explained By County Service

By Agricultural Extension Service, Los Angeles County Walnut Harvest

Take care of the nuts from those two or three walnut trees in your yard or the half dozen on your small farm. Send to the Agricultural Extension Service, 808 North Spring st., Los Angeles 15, for a leaflet giving suggestions for harvesting, drying, storing and bleaching small quantities of walnuts.

Tramping down the tops of onions will not make the bulbs mature. It will do more harm than good. The onion will mature only when it has been in the ground long enough, when the growing conditions permit, and you can't hurry it up by smashing down the tops.

When onions become mature, naturally the tops will gradually weaken and begin to fall over. When about one-third or one-half of the plants show broken tops, stop irrigating so that the bed can dry out.

In a couple of weeks you can pull the onions and lay them on the ground with the tops shading the bulbs. In a matter of a week, the tops and roots will be dry enough to break off. Break away everything that is

dry enough. Put the onions in slatted trays or open mesh onion bags in the shade where there is good ventilation. In another three or four weeks the balance of the tops will be dried and can be trimmed close to the bulb. Store in winter in a well-ventilated cool place in the crates or open mesh bags.

Sweet Potatoes For sweet potatoes which will store the longest, don't dig until frost. Do not irrigate after mid-September so that new top growth will stop.
