

Foremen Vote To Be Part Of Management

A 10-point program emphasizing the role of foremen in management was approved in St. Louis Saturday at the convention of the National Association of Foremen.

Attending the parley from Torrance was Glenn E. Middleton, steel mill superintendent at the National Supply Co., who is president of the National Supply Management club, affiliated with the National Association of Foremen.

One point said that the N.A.F. "will not be satisfied until everyone in the United States recognizes that foremen and superintendents are members of management." This position is opposite to that of the National Labor Relations Board, which has ruled that foremen may properly be members of labor unions. No member of a labor union, it was pointed out, may be a member of the N.A.F.

Other points which assumed importance were that foremen, said N.A.F., will seek to "maintain and improve the standards of management as a profession, create, maintain and safeguard unity in all levels of management" and "encourage association between senior and junior executives."

The association also endorsed "full and uninterrupted production as the best single means of combating inflation."

Final Plans Set For Semi-Annual Scholastic Test

Final plans for the semi-annual scholastic tests to be conducted by the U. S. Civil Service Commission on Nov. 6, 1946, for applicants who desire appointments as cadet-midshipmen in the U. S. Merchant Marine Cadet Corps were completed recently.

Accepted applicants who desire to become officers in the U. S. Merchant Marine receive a four-year course of training as cadet-midshipmen comparable to a college education. The course covers both academic and practical subjects, the first year of which is given at U. S. Merchant Marine Cadet Corps schools at either San Mateo, Calif., or Pass Christian, Miss., then one year aboard a training or merchant ship at sea with the final two years at the U. S. Merchant Marine Academy, known as "the Annapolis of the Merchant Marine," at Kings Point, N. Y.

Cadet-midshipmen receive \$65 monthly from the government while at the cadet school and serving aboard merchant vessels, they are paid at the rate of \$82.00 per month by ship operators. Quarters and subsistence are furnished at cadet school, academy and aboard ship.

Applications must be post-marked not later than Oct. 10, 1946, addressed to: Supervisor, U. S. Merchant Marine Cadet Corps, Training Organization, Washington, 25, D. C.
