**Circulators Of Water District Petitions Get Immediate Results**

Within a few days after circulation of petitions started, calling for an election to form the West Basin Municipal Water District, Gardena residents had subscribed nearly 500 names to the documents against a required 169 names.

The petitions ask the Board of Supervisors to call an election placing the proposition of formation of the water district and investigation of additional sources of water before the people. Similar petitions are being circulated in other cities and communities in the West Basin, including Lomita.

Signatures of 10 percent of the qualified electors of each city which is to be included in the proposed district must be obtained on the petitions, it was pointed out, and in the case of Gardena this would be approximately 169 names.

However, those circulating petitions are anxious to obtain many more signatures because some may be disqualified and because the sum-total of all signatures obtained in the district must represent ten percent of the actual vote cast in the entire West Basin area at the last gubernatorial election.

The county counsel has advised that within 90 days following the validity of the petitions an election will be called and if a majority vote in favor of the proposition is secured, a water district will be formed.

The petitions are being circulated under the direction of the recently formed West Basin Municipal Water District Campaign Committee, an action group which is an outgrowth of the Southwest Water Fact Finding Committee. The cities of Inglewood, Hawthorne, El Segundo, Manhattan Beach, Hermosa Beach, Gardena, Redondo Beach, Palos Verdes Estates, Lennox, Lawndale and adjoining unincorporated areas, are cooperating in an attempt to find a solution to the water shortage problem.
