Sweet Potato Vine Cutter Demonstrated

A successful sweet potato vine cutter was demonstrated by the Agricultural Extension Service at a meeting on the R. B. Marchbank ranch in Artesia and the Fusano Brothers ranch near San Fernando, Tuesday and Wednesday, October 29 and 30.

The machine carries a rapidly rotating knife which cuts across the top of the bed at intervals varying from four to seven inches depending upon the speed of the tractor.

The vines are cut into relatively short pieces and thrown to one side, thus cleaning the top of the bed. Two rolling knives follow, which cut down the sides of the bed and roll any remaining vines into the furrow, partly covering them with soil.

The vine crown for an inch or two above the ground is left intact. This holds the hill together during the digging, reduces bruising, and makes it easier to lift the potatoes for snapping.

The meeting was held by the Agricultural Extension Service with H. W. Schwalm, assistant farm adviser in Los Angeles, in charge. Marchbank said it took one man an hour to cut the vines from a single bed. The machine did the same work in four minutes.

Legion Post Of Guardsmen Being Organized Here

Formation of a Torrance post of the Legion of Guardsmen is in process, and all former members of the California State Guard, who served during the emergency period, are being urged to attend a meeting tonight at 7:30 o'clock in the State Armory in Torrance ball park.

James Wilkes, first sergeant of Company H, 2nd Battalion, 39th Regiment, California State Guard, has been named by the local group as temporary chairman of the post and will continue in that capacity until officers are elected, it was said.

Steps are being taken to secure a charter for the new Legion of Guardsmen post here. There already are 10 in California and several hundred throughout the United States. Former and present members of the National Guard also are eligible for membership in the order.

Many California State Guardsmen have a war and emergency record of six years, dating back to 1940 when the National Guard was called into Federal service. Long before Pearl Harbor, prior to the time when sufficient Federal forces were mustered to take over their tasks, State Guardsmen were conducting security work, beach patrol and other tasks under orders of the government in view of the emergency.

Local CAP Adds New Squadron: Glider Pilots!

The Third Group of the Civil Air Patrol will launch a new squadron Friday night to be composed of glider pilots, the first of its kind in any of the 48 Wings throughout the nation, according to Major C. H. Holmes, commander.

The Southern California Soaring association, which has been instrumental in forming the new squadron within the patrol, has during the past week made several test soaring hops from the local flight strip, Holmes said.

Many of the new squadron members are glider veterans of the past world war.

The south taxi ramp of the field will be used by the soarsers, who also will instruct in the technique of powerless flight. To avoid confusion with the power crafts entering and leaving the field, a left-hand pattern will be observed by the glider pilots, which will track their course near the Palos Verdes hills, where the thermos will aid in keeping the gliders aloft.

The gliders will be towed by autos for their takeoffs, and in some instances airplanes will be used to launch their motor-
