Since it would not only be an appropriate time but the dedication and Torrance would receive coast-to-coast publicity...

"We have interested Gabriel Heatter in your adventures as a possible broadcast subject for Dec. 7. The dedication of the field on or about Dec. 7 would be excellent and in that connection it might be advisable to tell us whom to contact in Torrance, who would have authority in the matter. You can see what a smash ending it would make for an exciting story..."

Quotations given above from letters to Captain Zamperini spurred the Torrance Herald, the City Aviation Commission, the Chamber of Commerce and the City Council to action, with the result that on Nov. 26 the Chamber of Commerce directors adopted a resolution and passed it on to the City Council asking that the Torrance municipal airport be officially named as "Zamperini Field."

The City Council concurred.
