**South Bay Area Voters Indorse School Bonds**

South Bay voters and those of the Perry school district in North Torrance approved by 2,582 to 796 a school bond issue of \$1,133,000 for the Redondo Union High School district.

The bonds are for building and equipping additional classrooms and industrial shops, a cafeteria and library building, and a new girls' gymnasium; improving the physical education setup, including enlarging and providing additional bleachers at the football stadium; acquiring a site for a new school in the Manhattan Beach-Hermosa Beach area.

While North Torrance voters in the Perry district had a voice in the election, they probably will escape obligation under the bonds since they are a part of the new Torrance City School district, which is provided for in the City Charter adopted on Aug. 20.


