Howard Ellis, of Evanston, Ill., will present the program. The visiting artist, who studied under Warner Sallman and at the Chicago Art Institute and the American Academy of Art, recently thrilled a vast audience in the Shrine auditorium with a religious representation of Christ. With effective musical and lighting background, the story of the picture was given. It was told how the artist was challenged to present a "Manly Christ," a man of courage and strength.

The artist is associated with Dr. Albert E. Day in the New Life Crusade which is being conducted in hundreds of leading churches throughout America. He has stood before vast audiences which have all been deeply moved by his representations. In a recent assembly at the Torrance High School, Mr. Ellis was most enthusiastically received. Miniature Chest X-Rays Total 400,000 A Year

Tuberculosis associations in California, now conducting their annual Christmas Seal sale, are taking free miniature chest X-rays at the rate of more than 400,000 a year, it was revealed by the state association.

Nineteen of the sixty local associations own or have ordered and await delivery of equipment for this service. Smaller associations rent equipment for conducting mass X-ray surveys, either from the state association which operates two machines, or from other local associations.

The goal of the associations is the X-ray of all adults in the state. Eradication of tuberculosis as a public health menace is based on prevention of the spread of infection and discovery and treatment of the disease in its early stages, authorities agree.

Public education has been and still is the principal weapon since the organization of the anti-tuberculosis movement. In California the tuberculosis death rate has been reduced from 205 deaths per 100,000 population in 1910 to 40.7 deaths in 1945. All of the services and educational materials of the tuberculosis associations are free to the public and are paid for by Christmas Seal proceeds.

Founders of the first Christmas Seal sale in the United States in 1907 are honored this year. Lithograph of their pictures appear on each sheet of seals. They are: Jacob Riis, philanthropist and writer, who suggested the use of such a seal; Miss Emily P. Bissell of Wilmington, Delaware, who conducted the first seal sale; E. A. Van Valkenburg, publisher, and Leigh Mitchell Hodges, columnist, who promoted the sale in the Philadelphia North American.


