The same disastrous results were obtained when the student faced a mountainous thunderstorm; the "cocky" pilot goes aloft to fan his ego by "showing off" too close to the ground; pilots fly in pea-soup fog without experience, or, with a craft not properly equipped for instrument flying and blind landings; or, by the stupid fellow who still believes that gasoline gauges are correct.

The extraordinary safety record and high daily utilization established by the Alaska Division of the Air Transport Command in subzero weather, ranging as low as 60 degrees below the zero mark, in the worst flying weather in the world, was easily attributable to wise leaders encouraging young pilots to obey their hunches, or, their strange intuition, to stay on the ground when they felt that it was not safe for them to fly.

The ambition to be the oldest living pilot can only be gained after one learns when not to fly.

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

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
