

Zamperini Is Named Head of National POWs

Captain Louis Zamperini has been honored again, this time by being made national president of Our Last Mission club, an organization formed of former prisoners of war.

Zamperini, whose world-wide fame as a distance runner and Olympic contestant contributed to the hardships endured during years as a prisoner of the Japs, was named president of the organization last week.

Our Last Mission club was formed by Dad MacMannis, Los Angeles short wave fan who for 22 months sat by his receiving set from 12 to 15 hours a day listening for messages from Japanese propaganda stations and other sources regarding service men declared missing or dead. It is reported MacMannis and his wife intercepted more than 20,000 messages and sent more than 15,000 reports of good cheer regarding lost service men to their families.

The purpose of the organization is to sustain the fellowship created during hardships suffered in prison camps and to watch after the interests of wounded P.O.W. comrades, it was announced.

After the plane on which Zamperini was bombardier fell in the South Pacific, the captain spent some 47 days on an open raft before being picked up. He was imprisoned in Tokyo until released by American troops.
