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**Record of Employment Considered
In Finding CUI Benefit Eligibility**

(Editor's note: This is the third in a series of four articles to be published in the Torrance Herald surveying California's Unemployment Insurance system. This installment discusses eligibility requirements and benefit payments.)

California's Unemployment Insurance act provides for payment of cash benefits to individuals who are unemployed either for economic reasons or mental disability. A wage earner's eligibility for benefits and the amount he may receive during his "benefit year" are determined by his record of employment and wages during his "base period." Both are established when a claim for benefits is filed. The benefit year is a one-year period beginning with the day the claim is filed. The base period is the first four out of the last five completed calendar quarters immediately preceding the first day of the benefit year.

To be eligible for unemployment insurance, the employee must have earned at least \$800 in subject employment during his base period; he must also be unemployed, file a claim for benefits, be able to work and available for work, register for work at state employment service office, and not be disqualified under any other provision of the law. He also must serve a "waiting period" of one week, during each benefit year, which is non-compensable.

Total benefits payable to an individual during his benefit year range from \$16 to \$468, depending on his total earnings in subject employment during his base period. Benefits are paid weekly at rates ranging from \$10 to \$20 based upon wages received during the base period quarter in which his earnings were highest.

An employee who without good cause leaves his job, or refuses to take suitable job offered to him, or who is discharged for misconduct is disqualified from receiving benefits for a period of from two to five weeks. A similar disqualification is imposed for making a false statement or for disqualification may be extended for an additional period not to exceed eight weeks in cases of successive or repeated disqualifications. A person who leaves his job because of a trade dispute is disqualified for a long as he remains out of work because of the dispute. The claimant receives his benefit claim in person at one of the department's local offices. He automatically renews his registration for work when he certifies to his continued unemployment.

The above eligibility requirements and disqualification provisions apply to payment of benefits for unemployment due to economic reasons. Payment of disability insurance is regulated by a separate set of eligibility requirements, but is subject to the same causes for disqualification. Minimum earnings of \$300 and a waiting period are required, except that the waiting period must be served for each period of disability. In addition, the applicant must be unemployed because of a disability, must file a claim which includes a medical certificate, and must submit to a reasonable examination if required by the department. Disability insurance will not be paid to a person who is receiving unemployment insurance, workmen's compensation or servicemen's readjustment allowance.
