Asphalt Concrete For Parking Lots Best, Says Jain

Asphalt concrete surfacing for parking lots in the central business district will cost only one-half cent a square foot more than oil mix which has been suggested to the city, according to City Engineer G. M. Jain.

He told the City Council Tuesday night that the asphalt concrete surfacing will cost 9 1/2 cents a foot while the proposed oil mix will cost 9 cents. He said the total cost for a 80-foot lot would amount to \$700, including grading, materials and paving.

The Retail Merchants division of the Chamber of Commerce had suggested that several downtown lots be surfaced to provide off-street parking for employees and customers.

No action was taken by the Council after Jain's report.

Mrs. Wright Asks Accommodations For Teachers

Urging that it must be the policy of the Torrance City Board of Education that teachers and administrators in the new school system live in Torrance if possible, Mrs. Grace W. Wright, candidate for the Board of Education at the March 18 election yesterday called upon local property owners and others to be prepared to rent rooms or dwellings to the teachers.

"Torrance will receive many benefits if its teachers and school officials are able to find homes here," Mrs. Wright said, "and its citizens can build better schools and a better community by accepting this responsibility."

"Boarding teachers" still is as popular now as it has been since the beginning of our country's schools, Mrs. Wright pointed out.

"School personnel make a welcome addition to any community," Mrs. Wright said. "Not only do the teachers develop a greater interest in the children but they help raise the cultural standards and curb juvenile delinquency."

"Cities which have their own schools build their community life around the schools, and this cannot be done unless the teachers are a part of the community."

"The Board of Education which is to be elected March 18 can ask the teachers to live in Torrance, but they must add it possible."

30-DAY EXTENSION ON LOMITA PARK WORK IS GRANTED

An extension of 30 days for the completion of the work now in progress for the development of Lomita Park, was granted to H. J. Farrington, contractor, by the Board of Supervisors at its Tuesday meeting.
