Bradley Orders Reschedule Of VA Office Hours

Effective immediately, the Veterans Administration downtown contact office at 1041 S. Broadway will be closed all day Saturdays and Sundays and will be open from 8 a. m. to 8 p. m. Mondays through Fridays. This change is in accordance with General Omar N. Bradley's order to reschedule office hours wherever possible. L. C. Chapman, regional manager, announced today.

The West Los Angeles VA regional contact office at 1380 Sepulveda Blvd., heretofore open until noon on Saturdays, will observe regular hours from 8 a. m. to 3:40 p. m. and will be closed all day Saturdays and Sundays.

Veterans who would ordinarily visit the regional offices on Saturdays should avail themselves of VA services after their work hours until 8 p. m. at the downtown office, Chapman explained. VA contact representatives will change their usual hours in order that an adequate staff may be on hand to render maximum service to veterans during the full twelve-hour period.

Oil Operators Spend Millions In Exploring

American oil operators have spent more than \$100,000,000 exploring the strata below 12,000 feet in the United States in their search for petroleum. The 326 wells in this deep drilling class have cost from \$89,000 to more than \$1,000,000 per well with an overall average of \$250,000, according to a survey in The Petroleum Engineer by Ernestine Adams, associate editor.

For the 106 deep wells drilled in 1946, the average rose to \$337,000, reflecting the sharp upturn in costs. Less money is required to drill deep in the swamplands of Louisiana, which has 144 wells below 12,000 feet, costing an average of \$230,000. California's 64 deep wells average \$333,000 and the 66 in Texas run about \$351,000 each.

Despite high costs, number of deep wells has increased greatly in the last four years: 17 in 1943, 37 in 1944, 60 in 1945 and 106 in 1946, striking evidence of the trend in petroleum search.

The deepest hole at present is in Caddo County, Oklahoma. Superior Oil Company No. 1 Well, which recently went below the 1946 record of 16,668 feet made by the Pacific Western Oil Corporation's deep test in Kern County, California. Record for the deepest producing well is held by Shell Oil Company No. 2 Smith-State, Iberia Parish, Louisiana. It had an initial production of 484 barrels of oil and 587,000 cubic feet of gas a day from 13,778 feet.

There is less difference today between the record hole and record deep production than there was in 1935 when the drill first passed 12,000 feet. Production at these depths have been discovered in Louisiana, California, Texas and probably Mississippi. Non commercial quantities of oil and gas have been found in other sections.

The spirit of pioneering in deep drilling is spreading to more companies and more areas. Until 1947 there were 29 companies owning wells drilled 2 1/3 to 3 miles into the earth. The number grew to 61 operators in 1946. Also in 1946 Wyoming got its first deep well, Venezuela got its first and second, and Ecuador was added to the list. Now 10 states have 318 deep wells and the other 8 are in Canada, Venezuela, Ecuador and Germany.
