### Torrance Plan To Cut Living Costs Advanced By Merchants Of City

Forecasting the inception of a plan which may spread throughout the nation, the project committee of the newly organized Retail Business division of the Torrance Chamber of Commerce announced yesterday the "Torrance Plan to Cut the Cost of Living."

Realizing that economic conditions bred by war are no longer with us and that if action is going to be taken to cut living costs it must begin somewhere, the committee formulated a four-point program which will be placed into effect in every store in Torrance within the next few weeks.

The plan itself is simple. It is so vital here in Torrance as well as throughout the nation, that there was little question among observers here that the "Torrance Plan" would soon be the accepted formula to lead the country back to normality.

It is this:

1. To clear the shelves of all stores of high-priced merchandise.
2. To maintain the standard of quality and style which the public demands.
3. To refuse to purchase additional merchandise from all manufacturers whose merchandise is "out of line" with the Torrance plan.
4. To establish better living conditions in Torrance by a reduction of living costs as a model for the rest of the nation.

The program will be placed into effect as rapidly as possible and identification of the merchants pledged to the plan will be announced in the near future.
