Determination To Stop Dump Burning Voiced

Supervisor Raymond V. Darby, chairman of the Board of Supervisors, reported Tuesday that the sheriff and all other departments concerned in the supervision of rubbish disposal control were instructed to stand by to stop burning by May 1 in the three dumps located at 1200 W. Imperial highway, operated by Leonard Elymyn, 1401 W. 120th st., under the control of Arthur Kazarian, and the one southwesterly of 1400 W. Imperial highway owned by E. P. Shoemaker.

During the supervisors' meeting the question arose of closing out the burning method in rubbish disposal dumps throughout the county and the question was referred to Regional Planning Commission for investigation of the legal phases, as the permits covering such dumps contain clauses which demand careful study before any enforcement can be practiced. The survey is to be presented to the Board approximately Aug. 1.
