### Township To Be Divided, Darby Reveals Here

Inglewood Judicial Township will be divided in the near future, throwing Torrance, Redondo Beach, Gardena, Lomita, Hermosa Beach and Palos Verdes into one township, Supervisor Raymond V. Darby, chairman of the Board of Supervisors, told the Torrance Herald this week.

The other communities in the Inglewood township include Inglewood, El Segundo, Hawthorne, Lawndale and Manhattan Beach, and they will have a separate township.

Considerable investigation has been made of the problem, Supervisor Darby said, and the population growth in the area warrants the division of the township.

One justice court now is being maintained in Inglewood and another at 16525 S. Western avenue. Upon separation, the courts will remain the same, Darby indicated.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a public hearing will be held before the Planning Commission of the City of Torrance, in the Council Chambers, City Hall, at 8:00 o'clock, p.m. on Tuesday, May 6th, 1947, to consider the following matters:

CASE No. 76: Petition of John Mayer, to use and occupy the ten acre parcel of land, including the buildings thereon, in Block 12, Walteria Tract (south of Madison and Newton Streets), for the processing and treating of diatomaceous earth for manufacturing building materials and other articles from said substances. This property is located in an A-1 (Light Agricultural) Zone, which prohibits such use.

CASE No. 77: Petition of Seaside Ranches for a change of zone covering all of Tract No. 1201, situated on the north side of Pacific Coast Highway, at the west City boundary from an A-1 (Light Agricultural) Zone to R-1 (Single Family Residential), excepting Lot 1, Block 5, which it is desired to change to a C1 (Retail Commercial) Zone, and Lot 23, Block 4, to park and recreational purposes.

All persons interested in the above petitions are requested to be present at this hearing, or to submit their written approval or disapproval to the City Engineer's office, City Hall, TORRANCE CITY PLANNING COMMISSION.


