There are approximately 128,000 veterans of World War I and previous wars, and 618,000 veterans of World War II residing in the Los Angeles Veterans Administration regional area.

This area covers Los Angeles, San Bernardino, Kern, Orange, Riverside, Ventura, Santa Barbara, San Luis Obispo and Inyo counties in California, and Lincoln and Clark counties in Nevada.

The total population for this same area as estimated by the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce is 4,673,000. In other words, every sixth person in the 11 counties is a veteran.

A few more than 15,000 of the veterans are women. Three hundred and fifty thousand veterans have applied for one or more of the federal benefits processed by the Los Angeles VA office. This means there are 350,000 case folders in the regional office.

Eighty-four thousand, two hundred and twenty-three veterans are drawing pensions or compensation for disabilities. Twenty-seven thousand, six hundred and one have completed loans for home, business or farms under the Servicemen's Readjustment Act (G.I. Bill). The value of these loans now reach \$201,305,722. One million dollars in loans to veterans is approved every working day by the local VA loan guaranty office.

An average of 75,000 veterans per month are assisted in their federal benefit problems by the contact department of the regional office. More than 12,000 veterans in the area send in changes of address each month. These are only from veterans with case folders in the regional office who represent but half of the entire veteran population.

Fifteen thousand veterans with service-incurred diseases or disabilities receive out-patient treatments through the offices of the VA, California Physicians Service, and California Dental Association. Seventy thousand, five hun-

Director Cites Large Increase In FHA Business

Greatly increased volume of business in the Los Angeles District office of the Federal Housing Administration and the limited personnel to handle it has made it necessary to establish public contact hours for the Underwriting Section, it was announced by John E. McGovern, district director.

Accordingly, beginning April 1 1947 public contact hours have been established from 2:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. The Underwriting section will be closed to the public except during that period of the day.

For those who may find it necessary to contact that section during those hours, it is suggested that they arrange for an appointment either by telephone or by calling at room 1022, 112 W. Ninth st.

The above established hours will not apply to the General Information Section, room 224, or to the administrative offices, 11th floor, which will continue to maintain the usual hours of from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. "This action was necessary to improve FHA's service to the public in the shortening of the processing time on applications submitted for loan insurance," McGovern said.

Eight thousand, one hundred and sixty-two are patients in the three VA hospitals in the area. Of this number 1,309 have service-connected disorders; 2,784 non-service-connected disorders, and 3,292 are under domiciliary care.

Five hundred and thirty-nine veterans who have lost one or both legs, or the use of both legs as a result of their World War II service, have applied for free automobiles as authorized by the 79th session of Congress.

Nearly 20,000 letters per day are received by the main room of the regional office from veterans.

Approximately 4,000 children of deceased veterans have their estates supervised by the legal department of the regional office.
