Owners of rental property in Torrance this week were urged by City Superintendent of Schools J. H. Hull to register possible vacancies with the school administrative office at 2093 Torrance Blvd., as they will be needed by teachers of the Torrance schools.

Hull urged that owners wanting to sell homes also list their properties. He asked that rentals of apartments, houses or rooms, with and without housekeeping, be listed and said a card index will be maintained at the school office.

It is estimated that some 75 units will be needed for the teachers and non-certificated workers.

Torrance City School district is getting along fine without money, it was indicated this week.

On the promise to pay after July 1, earliest date that funds can be secured by the new district, a building has been leased at 2093 Torrance Blvd., furniture has been secured, typewriters and other equipment provided. Superintendent J. H. Hull and Assistant Superintendent E. W. Ingram now are working full time, but will not get any pay until after July first.
