New 'Gayway' At Redondo Beach Attracting Many

Redondo Beach—long famous for excellent fishing and scenic beauty—has opened a new "Gayway" amusement area that is attracting thousands of Southern California pleasure seekers.

Overlooking the surf where the bathers frolic the "Gayway" features a variety of rides and concessions that promise fun for the whole family. There's a colorful merry-go-round and other rides for children, as well as more exciting aerial rides.

Dancing to suit everyone's taste is offered at the newly-remodeled "Redondo Barn" dance hall. Friday and Saturday, western and old-time dancing is featured, and on Sunday the moderns take over as the orchestra offers medleys of the current favorite dance tunes.

On rising ground near the "Gayway" are spacious public picnic grounds. The picnic area is cooled by soft sea breezes and has become a favorite week end meeting place for many families.

Fishing is reported to be better than ever at Redondo this year, and the famous horseshoe pier is lined daily with anglers trying their luck—and finding it good. In addition to pier fishing, an off-shore barge is available, as well as boats going out on regular schedules for those who prefer to drop a line in deeper waters.

The "Gayway" has a wide choice of excellent eating spots. Everything from the hot dog to tasty sea foods and thick steaks is offered at numerous restaurants, stands and cocktail lounges.

Bowling, archery and other carnival-style amusements dot the "Gayway" with a large, enclosed roller-skating rink at the north end.

Redondo Beach is easy to reach by any transportation. By car, it's a quick, enjoyable drive west on Torrance boulevard. There's plenty of parking space at the beach. The Greyhound bus on Carson st., Cabrillo or Torrance boulevards also goes directly to Redondo.

New Self-Sealing Inner Tubes Made By U.S. Rubber

Self-sealing inner tubes that automatically seal punctures and make repairs unnecessary are now in production, H. O. Bock, U. S. Tire Manager of the United States Rubber Company, reveals.

The tire man said that a plastic rubber was the key to the safety development. The material, he explained, had the ability to flow around the puncturing object and fill the resulting hole when the object was removed. The sealing material is held in place by a honeycomb construction to insure against bunching up and shifting, according to Bock's statement.

"The inner tube represents years of development. Production, started before the war, was stopped by it," Bock said.

The first consideration in production schedules will be ambulances, fire department equipment, police cars, and other vehicles where puncture dangers are great and the elimination of roadside delays essential.

New U.C. Garden Insect Booklet Now Available

Ever hear of garden insects and pests? Did you ever see a garden which didn't have any pests?

The University of California has just issued a revision of its leaflet "Garden Insects, Related Pests, and Methods of Control." This revision brings up to date pest control methods for the home garden. When the previous issue was written, for example, DDT was relatively unknown. The new circular lists several uses, but also lists its limitations.

The gardener must know what to use for every pest, where to use it, when to use it, and on what crops. You should learn the pests and insects too. This circular is full of pictures.

Either calcium arsenate or cryolite dust mixed with sulphur is yet the first recommendation for control of all of the tomato worms and the tomato mites. DDT tends to encourage the development of aphids and red spiders by killing off the insects that eat the aphid and red spider. However, DDT will kill some insects that have been hard to handle. Pear slugs attack not only the leaves of pear trees, but like to chew on plum, quince and some other tree leaves. They're about three-eighths of an inch long, and an eighth of an inch wide. You will see them on the leaves in the early morning hours or at night. They crawl back and hide during the warm part of the day. Their food is the top surface of the leaf and they leave only the network of veins. Best control is a dust of calcium arsenate or cryolite, but if you don't have these any other kind of dust will do the trick, even pulverized sifted dirt from under the tree. However, this kind of dust will encourage red spider and so isn't too advisable.
