Haggott, developer of the tract, anticipates that at least 100 homes will have been completed and sold at Seaside Ranchos by September, and Torrance school authorities already are cognizant of the schooling problem which this new development will present.

Teacher Hiring For Torrance Nearly Finished

The teacher employment situation for Torrance City School district for the first year of operation, starting Sept. 15, is practically soved, Superintendent of Schools J. H. Hull told the Board of Education Tuesday night.

"We are down to just a few vacancies, one or two in several levels," Hull declared. "We are particularly interested in finding a couple of good kindergarten teachers."

Among teachers elected Tuesday night are:

Fannie B. Beasley, kindergarten, \$2700; Helen Wieman, kindergarten, \$2700; Venus M. Knoll, grade 1, \$3200; Veda L. Knoll, grade 1, \$3200; Edna Earle Wright, grade 2, \$3200; Marian A. Downing, grade 4, \$3200; Jennings Davidson, grade 6, \$3000; Evangeline Morros, grades 7 or 8, \$2800.

Hull told the Board of Education that had he been able to anticipate the success in getting good teachers, he would not have found it necessary to hire any of the "emergency" teachers who are under contract for next year.
