Colorado River Assn. Formed For Protection Of Water Rights

Needy In L.A. County Receive \$5,412,090 Aid

Needy people in Los Angeles County received \$5,412,090 during May, 1947, compared with \$4,449,898 for May, 1946, California Taxpayers' Association said today, studying the trend of the cost of aid to the needy in California counties.

Relief payments in the county during May, 1947, were financed \$2,066,209 from the federal government, \$2,036,513 from the state treasury, and \$1,309,368 by the county.

Over the state as a whole, \$11,816,122 was paid in aid to the needy during May, 1947, compared with \$9,560,544 for May, 1946.

Navy Enlistment Now From Two To Six Years

Revision of enlistment terms in the United States Navy, was announced by David C. Whisman, chief in charge of the Navy Recruiting station, Long Beach.

Whisman said that he had just received word from Washington, D. C., that men enlisting or re-enlisting in the regular Navy, within three months from date of discharge, or Naval Reserve personnel enlisting or re-enlisting within three months from date of first demobilization discharge, can now sign up for either 2-, 4- or 6 years, depending upon the man's own choice. The one exception is men 17 years of age, who will be enlisted or reenlisted for 2 or 3 years only.

SAFETY ZONE CAUTION
The presence of a safety zone for pedestrians at street car stops, wide street intersections or elsewhere, does not give the motorist the right to travel past such points at undiminished speeds. The rule that he may pass without coming to a halt—as was the case prior to safety zone use—is modified by the requirement that the car shall proceed only at such speed as permits full control of it by the driver that may arise.

U.S. ARMY HOLDS \$2,000,000 IN UNCLAIMED BONDS

The Torrance Area Veterans Service Center announced this week that two million dollars in war bonds belonging to veterans and servicemen are held unclaimed in the U. S. Army Finance Center in St. Louis.

The bonds were originally mailed to the latest available addresses of the owners and were returned unclaimed.

Veterans who have bonds coming to them may obtain assistance at the Torrance Center. They should bring in full information on when and where the bonds were applied for and the center will help file for settlement.
