Distribution Of Victory Medals Starts August 1

Distribution of American Defense Service medals, with Fleet or Base clasps, and World War II Victory medals to all eligible veterans of the Naval service and personnel now on active duty will start Aug. 1, the Eleventh Naval district disclosed today. It is estimated that 200,000 men and women will apply in the Eleventh Naval district, which comprises the California counties of Santa Barbara, Kern, San Bernardino, Los Angeles, Ventura, Orange, Riverside, Imperial and San Diego; Clark County, Nevada and the entire states of Arizona and New Mexico.

The huge job of processing the applications and distributing the medals has been assigned to Naval recruiting stations throughout the nation. Delivery of medals will be made to applicants only upon personal presentation of discharge certificate, certificate in lieu thereof, or release orders in the case of officers, accompanied by the NavPers Form 553, Notice of Separation, where available. In no case will the medals be issued if the character of the separation is in doubt. Naval recruiting stations are situated in the following Eleventh Naval district cities: Los Angeles, Glendale, Santa Barbara, Bakersfield, Long Beach, San Bernardino, Santa Ana and San Diego.

All Rationing Of Sugar Concluded

All sugar rationing came to an end this week because the Government does not have the money to finance it further. This action, announced by the Agriculture Department, affected only industrial and institutional users such as food processors, bakers, candy makers, bottlers, hospitals and hotels.

Household rationing ended about two months ago. Officials are still of the opinion that, despite improvement in supplies, sugar is not plentiful enough to meet all demands at current ceiling prices.

The government decided, nevertheless, to keep present price ceilings. It will attempt to prevent big users from buying large quantities and hoarding them. It placed limitations on the quantity which such users may hold in their inventories at any one time.
