




Nail Production At U.S. Steel Mills Is High

Nails by the billion are pouring from busy machines in the mills of the American Steel and Wire Company, Cleveland, Ohio, world's largest nail manufacturer, and on the Pacific coast at the Pittsburg (California) plant of Columbia Steel Co. Both companies are U. S. Steel Corporation subsidiaries.

"Nail production is being maintained at an exceptionally high rate," says C. F. Hood, president of the American Steel and Wire. "One of our mills recently shipped in one week more nails than during any other week this year." Currently, approximately 150 car loads—or over a billion—nails are leaving our mills every week."
