Palos Verdes College Seeks Needed Funds

Palos Verdes College, new two-year coeducational college in Rolling Hills which opens for the first time this month, is campaigning vigorously to raise an additional \$10,000.00 needed to meet pre-opening expenses, according to Winfield Scott Rash, college treasurer.

The college will open September 22nd. Money to defray costs of converting the AAF base in Rolling Hills into a modern college plant is being raised by contributions ranging from \$5.00 to \$1,000.00. The new college is a private, non-profit institution dependent entirely upon community support and student tuition. Contributions have been received from as far away as Chicago, San Francisco, and Washington, D.C., as well as from this area, stated Mr. Rash, who is Assistant Vice-President in charge of the California Bank in San Pedro.

Success of Palos Verdes College's appeal for funds depends largely upon its being the only small, private coeducational two-year college in southern California. Emphasis on small classes, individual instruction and a strong democratic tradition is attracting not only day and resident students from the southland but also students from such places as San Francisco, Chicago, Honolulu, France and Mexico.

Rep. Cecil R. King is motoring to California, vacationing enroute. Before he departed, the 17th district Congressman did not indicate when he expects to arrive in his district. He said he expects to be in San Francisco by Sept. 8, when the Tollerson fisheries subcommittee of the House is scheduled to open hearings on the fishery provisions of the proposed Japanese peace treaty.
