Gilmore Racing Tonight Features 60-Lap Main

The first 60-lap main event held since before the war will headline the midget car program tonight when Ed Haddad, Karl Young, Danny Oakes, Pee Wee Distaree, Perry Grimm, Chick Barbo and other AAA speedway favorites hit into the home stretch of the season at Gilmore stadium.

The extra distance main event has been scheduled as a special dividend for the thousands of Los Angeles school children, who return to school Sept. 14. Most of them will be kept busy with studies, and will be unable to witness a long midget event until the Thanksgiving night Grand Prix. The race Thursday will be the San Pedro Sweepstakes.

"King Kar" Young steps up with Haddad and Oakes as a favorite this week, following his blistering 40-lapper or last Thursday night when he lowered the Gilmore record for that distance to 10:14.965. Young, who always turns in a masterful job at the controls of Howard Keck's No. 30 Oriennauer, has now won three 47 main events, and holds two records. In addition to the 40-lap record, Young also holds the three-lap trophy dash standard of 44.4's.

Racing Thursday night starts at 8:30 o'clock, one-lap qualifying time trials at 7:00


Wilson-Boyd Signed For 10 Rounds In Bowl

Jackie Wilson, ranking challenger for the world welterweight title, and Jackie Byrd, veteran Southern California trial horse who gave Lew Jenkins one of his worst beatings, have been signed for the 10-round main event of the Wilmington Bowl's return to professional fights on Wednesday night, Sept. 24.

The Wilmington Bowl Boxing club of Ernie Steffens, owner of the Bowl and a Long Beach concessionaire, and Joe Craig, who has been staging amateur fights at the Harbor arena for nearly two years, was granted official pro license this week by the State Athletic Commission.

Amateur boxing, however, will continue in full swing at the Wilmington Bowl on Friday nights. Craig, who will serve as a matchmaker for both the pro show on Wednesday and the amateurs on Friday, announced yesterday that the two Jackies had been signed for the feature attraction on the opening card, which will have 32 rounds of action.

Albert (Sandy) Sandoval, Wilmington boy who graduated from the Harbor A. C. amateur into pro ranks last winter and is climbing the ladder fast, will oppose Sammy Manders in the six-round lightweight semi-windup. Four four-round preliminaries will complete the card.
