August Payment Of Torrance Sick Benefits \$22,633

Payments of sick benefits to the Torrance-South Bay area during August amounted to \$22,633.00. Over 5,000 persons suffering loss of wages due to sickness or non-industrial injury, received checks totaling \$228,620 last month from the Long Beach Disability Insurance office, according to V. L. Hetzel, district office manager.

"In order to be eligible for benefits under the California Disability Insurance Law," explains Mr. Hetzel, "an individual must have paid one percent of his wages into the State Disability Fund and his base period earnings must have totaled at least \$300."

Relative to proper time for filing disability claims, Mr. Hetzel adds, "A claim for disability, supported by a physician's certificate verifying the illness or injury, must be filed between the 15th and 21st day of disability. One may draw from a minimum of \$10 to a maximum of \$20 for each week he is disabled after a waiting period of seven days."
