TO ALL ON-SALE APPLICANTS Section 21 of the Alcoholic Beverage Act provides in part as follows: "All applicants for on-sale licenses shall, within five (5) days after filing their application with the Board, cause a notice of such application giving the name or names of the applicant and the premises where the business is to be conducted, to be published once in a newspaper of general circulation in the city in which such premises are situated, or if such premises are not in a city then such publication shall be made in a newspaper of general circulation in the county in which such premises are situated. Kiwanis Give Instruments To Schools
Superintendent J. Henrich Hull, of the Torrance City schools, presented a bass drum, three parade drums and a sousaphone to Abe Milstein, director of music of the Torrance City schools as a gift from the Kiwanis club for use in the school's instrumental music program, as a result of action of the board of directors of the Kiwanis club. In the preliminary remarks it was brought out that Milstein had been director of the "Berlin Bounders," a special service platoon of thirty men who entertained more than a million servicemen in Europe (E.T.O.) during the war. During the Battle of the Bulge, it was ironically pointed out, one of Milstein's duties was that of providing billets and supplying quarters in an old schoolhouse in Belgium for his platoon. In order to keep warm, the school furniture, which had been stored in the basement of this building, was used as fuel after all other available wood and combustible materials in the area had been used.
