

Modern Forum Issues Schedule For 21st Season

With the opening of the 21st season of The Modern Forum scheduled for Monday evening, October 27, in the Philharmonic Auditorium, Herman Lissauer, director, pointed out that season tickets for the entire series of eight outstanding lectures insure a saving of more than 33 percent, as well as guaranteeing the same choice seat for each outstanding personality who will address the adult educational institution.

"Our coming of age season," said Lissauer, "will be one of our most notable years bringing the world famous author Fannie Hurst; Commentator Cecil Brown, who, when covering Rome for the International News Service, had a world beat on the death of Pope Pius XI in 1939; Author Dr. Milton Silverman.

"Robert Maynard Hutchins, chancellor of the University of Chicago will return this year in response to popular demand; Maurice Hindus, generally conceded one of our most brilliant and forceful lecturers and writers; Commentator Raymond Gramme Swing will be our first speaker on October 27.

"Vilhjalmar Stefansson, America's greatest living Arctic explorer and international authority on the Arctic will lecture Nov. 24; Louis Adamic will appear Wednesday evening, Nov. 17."

Lissauer said all lectures would take place at the Philharmonic Auditorium and that season tickets may be purchased at the Philharmonic box office, the Modern Forum office in the Philharmonic Building, and at all Mutual Agencies.
